


APRIL 2020 SURVEY

Shatter Fund surveyed 40+ women led companies to see how COVID-19 has affected business

What We Found:

- Majority of women-led businesses surveyed report they're still operational (95%)
- Only a third (33.3%) of those surveyed report having to furlough employees
- But more than half of women-owned businesses have seen a decrease in capital available. Prior to the pandemic women received a fraction of capital available. A decrease could be detrimental for the success of women-owned businesses that are critical to an innovation economy, and a fully realized US GDP.





What We Found:

- Zoom was reported to be the most useful digital tool for women led businesses (41.8%)
- More than half (52.4%) of those surveyed reported a decrease in productivity
- Strain on mental health (47.6%), and homeschooling children (40.5%) were the next highest impacts on work and daily routine
